Cromford Village

Arkwright developed the village by building houses with a third storey for spinning, many of which survive today. By 1782, there were 5,000 people spinning locally. Guided audio tours available from the Mill shop.



Dunsley Meadows & Slinter Woodland

Follow the famous Bonsall Brook (which powered Arkwright's Mills) and enjoy the beautiful landscape of ancient woodland and meadows.


